HAZARDS

Please be aware of potential hazards on the course:

- Please avoid sheep as they have young lambs and may abandon them if disturbed
- Snakes may be active. If bitten apply a roller bandage, restrict movement and call for assistance.
- Many areas have thistles wearing gaiters will help
- Most of the roads are unsealed, have many blind corners and are hilly. Cars can travel quickly on these road so please take care. Walk towards oncoming traffic using head torches to illuminate yourself but not blind the driver. There may be 4WD vehicles using the Bridle track.
- Not every feature on the ground is on the map Many farm tracks are not shown and those shown might not be accurate.
- Mobile phone reception is very patchy on all of the course, but is usually available from the hill tops.

A REMINDER OF SOME IMPORTANT ROGAINING RULES

Every team member must pass within 5m of each control visited when the Control Card is being punched.

Team members must remain within earshot of each other at all times.

Any team hearing a distress signal must abandon their course and help in any way needed.

Do not leave any rubbish on the course (put lolly wrappers in your pocket!). Do not smoke or light fires on the course.

Leave gates as you find them. Take due care when crossing fences, crossing at corner posts, solid posts or between wires wherever possible.

Keep a reasonable distance from dwellings and sheep with young.

Please take care not to enter of out-of-bounds areas – in most cases a fence separates these areas
